June 25, 2021 – Actions for Our Own Dear Planet

Keep reducing plastic. The petrochemical industry and its pollution disproportionately harm people of color and low-income populations. Discarded plastic becomes micro-plastics that contaminate our water, soil, and food. *The answer to plastic pollution is not recycling.* Aim at zero plastic — or as close to zero as possible.

- **Styrofoam** is at least as harmful as plastic. Styrene, of which it's made, is a "probable carcinogen to humans." Thanks to thousands of petitions and calls, five states have banned single-use polystyrene plastic foam (Styrofoam).

- The **Break Free From Plastic Pollution Act** requires plastic producers to fund the work needed to manage their waste. It would begin a nationwide phase-out of the worst single-use plastics: Please ask your members of Congress to cosponsor this important legislation.
- **USE** thermoses, water glasses, cloth bags, paper straws, cups and plates. Bring your own take-home container if your restaurant uses plastic or styrofoam take-home containers.
- Ask that mailed items be wrapped and shipped with paper, not plastic.
 (Many companies will do this, or your request will alert them to do so.)
- Ask cleaners to return clothes without plastic covering.
